#### **Recipe Corner**

Jacqueline Nakasone made these pickles for the TC JACL picnic. I enjoyed them so much, I asked her to share the recipe!

#### **Easy Quick Korean Pickles**

Prep: 15 min Pickling time: 1 hr, 30 min Total time: 1 hr, 45 min

1 lb Persian cucumbers (about 6 small, 2-3 medium, or 1 large)

(Note: see recipe link for other cucumber types that can be used)

1/4 cup fresh cilantro (use soft stems and leaves)

1/3 cup rice wine vinegar

1 tsp toasted sesame oil

2 Tbsp granulated sugar

2 tsp kosher salt

½-1 tsp crushed red pepper flakes or 1 Tbsp Gochugaru

#### Instructions

- 1. Slice cucumbers into round slices or small wedges and roughly chop the cilantro.
- 2. Combine vinegar, sesame oil, salt, sugar, and red pepper flakes in a bowl and whisk until the sugar dissolves
- 3. In another bowl or jar, combine cucumbers and cilantro.
- 4. Pour vinegar mixture over the cucumbers and toss to coat.
- 5. Let cucumbers sit at room temperature for about 30 minutes, tossing every few minutes to coat them with the brine, then transfer to a glass jar and put in the refrigerator.
- 6. Once in the fridge, invert the jar a few times to make sure the seasoning distributes evenly.
- 7. Let the pickles sit in the fridge for at least an hour before enjoying them, but they will be even better if you let them sit overnight.



# **Education Report**

The education committee had another exciting and busy year in 2024. We kicked off the year with a conversation with Reiko Ho, playwright and director of *The Carp Who Would Not Quit and other Animal Stories*. The production ran through the winter at the Children's Theatre Company.

This fall, we will host the National Japanese American Historical Society for the teacher workshop, *Musicmakers: Bands Behind Barbed Wire* at Historic Fort Snelling.

The production, <u>Secret Warriors</u> by Rick Shiomi and directed by Lily Tung Crystal will run at the History Theatre from March 27 - April 19, 2025. It is a fictional portrayal based on experiences of the Military Intelligence Service. Education committee members consulted on the production and attended the staged reading. Accompanying the production this spring will be a temporary banner exhibit on the history of the MISLS in the History Theatre lobby, developed by the committee.
